#### PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE:

- Emptied trash at Lock 57
- Mowed and weed wacked borough parks and properties

- Cleaned the shop and power washed the floors

- Removed and cleaned hydraulic valves on boom mower and installed new blades
- Removed large tree that had fallen on swing set in small park in Meadowbrook
- Removed trees on Engle Ext, Westwood, Biellers Run, Ridgemont, and Wolf Run
- Installed Leonard's bench at Lock 57
- Cleaned storm drains
- Headwall for Wildwood has been delivered and excavator has been ordered
- Sharpened chainsaw blades

- Cleaned washout on Forrest Hill
- Replaced pavilion bulbs with LED lights and cleaned glass covers
- Chipped roads multiple times that are bleeding tar from hot weather
- Measured roads to be tar and chipped
- Ordered replacement swing seats and spare chains
- Roller brakes:
